Course Description:

This is a year-long course designed to provide students with an examination of modern world history. Students will begin with an exploration of the Renaissance and will continue on through the Reformation, Industrialization, European and American Revolutions, and Imperialism. We will then explore the social and political forces that shaped the world before, during and after World War I, World War II and the Cold War.

Written texts and class instruction will be supplemented by films, songs, art, primary documents and contemporary literature. Students will be held to high standards, and daily participation will ensure a greater understanding of the topics we are examining.

Required Materials:

1. 1” 3-ring binder (or section marked “World History” in a larger binder)
2. Loose leaf notebook paper, college-ruled
3. Several #2 pencils or blue or black ink pens

Students must have supplies by Monday, August 31. This will be a homework grade.

Course Policies & Procedures

Attendance:

- **Attendance is mandatory.** Students who miss class or who are late to class will miss important material. Per school policy, five unexcused absences will result in a failing grade (Fa – failure due to absences). Please refer to the Ellington community handbook for full attendance policies. **Nothing can substitute for attendance.**
- **Tardies.** Three unexcused tardies will count as an unexcused absence. Be in class **when the bell rings.**

Participation:

- I expect students to go to their lockers and utilize the restroom during the passing period. Participation points will be docked for students who routinely leave class.
- Points will be lost for interrupting a presenter (teacher or classmate), sleeping in class or otherwise disrupting the activity.

Academic Honesty:

Students who plagiarize or cheat will receive a zero for the given assignment. I will also schedule a conference with parents or guardians and the administration to discuss further disciplinary action.

Classroom Restrictions:

Do not bring the following items to class:

- Cell phones
- iPods
- food / drinks (except water)
- gum
- hats

Student Work:

- Assignments are due on the date specified **at the beginning of class**. Late work will not be accepted. Major projects will be docked 10% for each day they are late.
- Students are responsible for making up assignments when they are absent. Students excused for school activities should make arrangements before the scheduled activity and will have ONE WEEK from the date of the absence to make up work. **I am not responsible for making sure you do make up work.**
- Students are required to keep a portfolio of their work and class materials. This includes tests, quizzes, homework, handouts, class notes & handouts. Notebooks may be checked at any time.
