Course Description

This Exhibit Design course is a requirement for graduation, and uses all the skills exercised and acquired in Exhibit Design I. This course focuses on the brainstorming process of developing an exhibit from scratch. Students will create a portfolio of their finished products, and submit two proposals of exhibitions they create, using the principles and elements of design and space as their base.

Course Outline

Overall, students will conduct and express their ideas and proposal through conceptual thinking and readings from previous design theorists as their references. Students will develop works through multiple drawing assignments and construction projects. Further, they will engage in projects to explore more deeply the elements of design.
