COURSE DESCRIPTION

SENIOR PROJECT is a required course for all dance seniors, earns one Carnegie unit, meets three times per week and is for the entire school year. SENIOR PROJECT uses a non-directive teaching model to foster individual and group learning experiences in planning, acquiring responsibilities for one's own learning the skill to plan, follow-through, develop and implement the tasks/assignment at hand. The purpose of this non-directive teaching model is to establish interpersonal relationships that can facilitate personal/group productivity. This course also serves the goal of exposing dance students to practical experiences in alternative career paths in dance.
