Music History I focuses on the elements of music, Music of the Medieval Period, Renaissance Period, Baroque Period, Romantic Period, the 20th and 21st Periods and music from various global cultures.

- Students must arrive on time for class each day (Should a student arrive late, the student must have a pass) Three tardies equal one unexcused absence.**
