COURSE DESCRIPTION

The emphasis of this class will be on content, craftsmanship and the development of a personal point of view as an image-maker. Basic metering techniques, film exposure and the ability to utilize basic printing skills such as contrast control and burning in and dodging are essential. Projects are more concept driven than Photo I and students are expected to explore individual approaches to the medium based on personal interests, creative influences and individual experimentation. Each student will develop an individual project that will extend through a major portion of the semester and be presented as a cohesive portfolio of work.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Make informed choices about composition when photographing and editing digital images.
- Make informed choices about appropriate technologies for use in a variety of photographic assignments
- Create original works of art of increasing complexity and skill that reflect their feelings and point
- Demonstrate proper camera and digital processing techniques in production of a work of art.
