COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Art A course is a requirement for graduation. The focus of the course is an exploration of the life and work of selected artists. Students will examine the theories and practices of art and they will create their own works of art inspired by the artists they study. In general, the senior high Art A course is a survey of selected art movements and the artists that participated in them. Students demonstrate their knowledge of an artist's work or movement by producing works of art. The Washington area museums and their collections will be used as a resource.

COURSE OUTLINE

- I. Introduction to art and history
 - A. Demonstrate an understanding of the European, African and American art and selected artists

- II. Create an art work piece in the style of a selected artist
 - A. Discuss the style related to artist
 - B. Analyze the techniques used to render art
- III. How technology influence the artist choice of medium
 - A. Demonstrate knowledge of a materials and when they were invented
 - B. Examine the personal preference of artists through research/interviews
